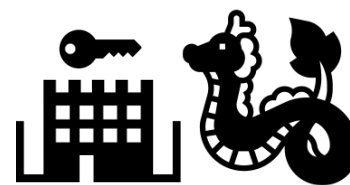

Robin Hood	A legendary English outlaw who robbed the rich to give to the poor.	

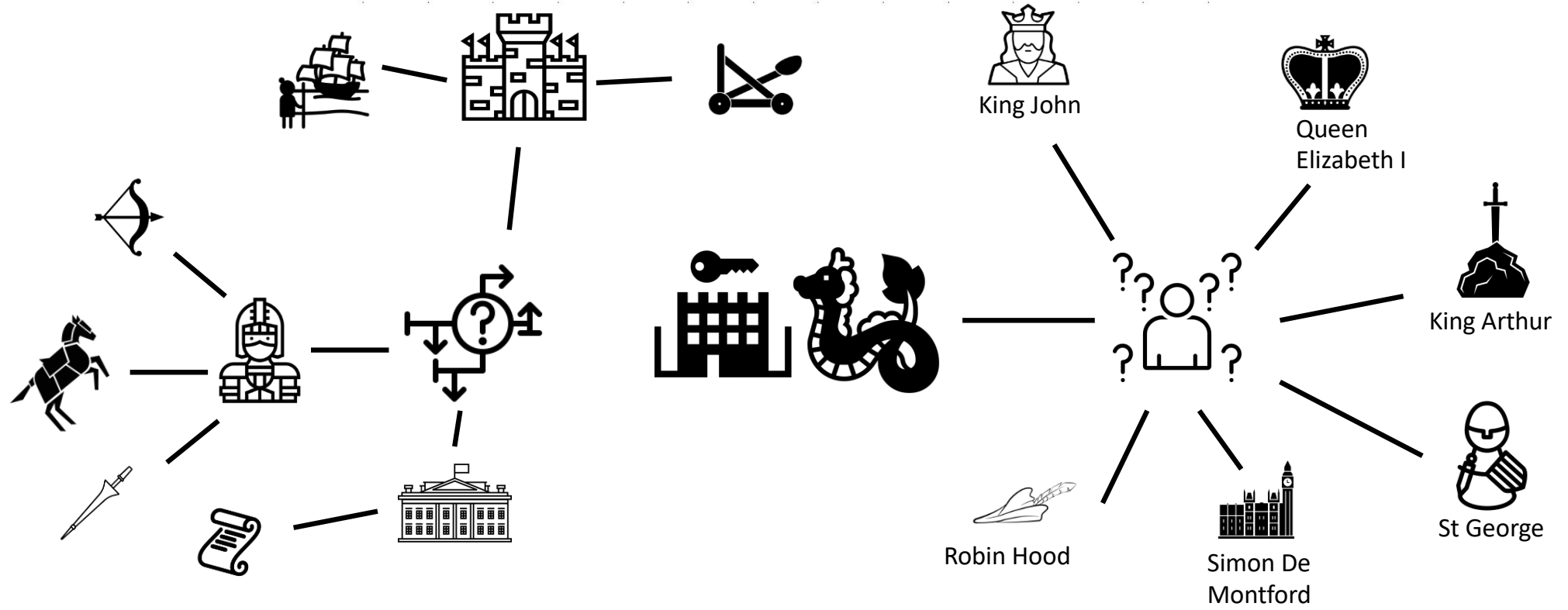
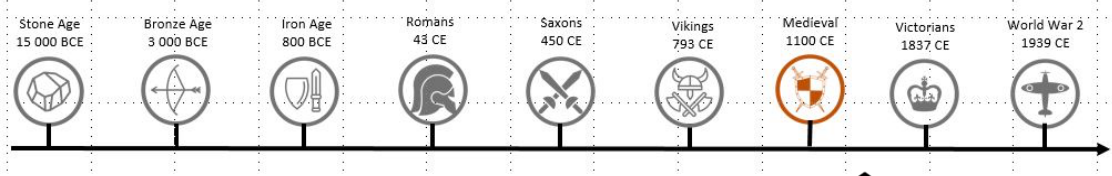


### What? (Key vocabulary)
