**Year 1 Spring**



**Prior Learning**

In Reception, we learnt about some of the animals that live in our local area and how they are different from each other. We also learnt about some life cycles, such as the life cycle of tadpoles and frogs.

**What? (Key vocabulary)**

<b>Energy</b>	How things are able to do work. Energy can be from light, heat, food or different forces
<b>Growth</b>	When living things get bigger as they get older.
<b>Habitat</b>	The place where an animal or plant lives.
<b>Carnivore</b>	Animals that eat other animals.
<b>Herbivore</b>	Animals that only eat plants.
<b>Omnivore</b>	Animals that eat both plants and other animals.
<b>Vertebrate</b>	Animals that have a backbone.
<b>Invertebrate</b>	Animals that do not have a backbone.
<b>Senses</b>	Parts of animals' bodies that help them take in information about the world around them.
<b>Hibernation</b>	When an animal goes into a deep sleep during winter because there isn't much food for it to eat.

**Who? (Significant people)**

<b>Jane Goodall</b>	Studies the behaviour of chimpanzees and other apes in the wild.
<b>David Attenborough</b>	Shares information about the natural world through television and books so everyone can understand.
