### Message from the Headteacher

WELCOME to all - to those returning, and to all of you who have joined, or are about to join, the Templars community. We hope you already feel like you belong.

It has been a really positive start to the year, although rather warm. Pupils, parents and staff were looking fresh faced and raring to go on Wednesday and rather sweaty on Friday! Staff returned last Friday and have undergone training on subjects such as Safeguarding, supporting pupils with Autism and developing children's resilience. We will continue to focus on getting children reading this year, reducing absences and lateness, and of course improving outcomes for all of our pupils. Thanks to the effort of the whole school community, twice as many Year 1 children passed their Phonics Screening last year than the year before.

You will notice in the Diary Dates, Year group meetings begin next week. We have put them at two times, 3.30 and 5.30pm, to hopefully support working parents and I promise they won't be long. They will give you an opportunity to ask any questions and allow us to target information relevant

to you and your child. In the meantime, teachers have their doors open at the end of every day and please feel free to drop in, say hello and have a look at the new surroundings.

I know communication is always brought up as an area parents would like us to improve on, so please ensure you have all of our suggested Apps: Seesaw for communication with the class teacher and for homework and messages; My Child at School to keep us up to date with your contact details in case of emergency and other essential data; Studbugs to report absence and to receive messages through; Parentpay to pay for dinners and trips. The Templars facebook page is NOT monitored by school, although I know many helpful parents share important information on there. You should have received letters this week with information on what topics and spellings your child will be learning about this term and the Website is constantly updated throughout the year (my weekend project!) and has a wealth of further information. While I have your attention, make sure you always scroll down through the newsletter for support, advice and advertisements of things to do in the local area. Let me know if you have something to share on these pages. Finally many teachers and teaching assistants share good news and pictures on Twitter, or X if you prefer, especially when on trips.

We have had a lot of maintenance and cleaning work done in school during the holidays and you will have noticed that the ongoing roof tile replacement has overrun. The roofers promise me that all work will be completed within the month and we all look forward to no leaks this Winter! One project I am very proud of is the toilets; over my nearly seven years at Templars, children have been reporting in surveys that the two places they felt least safe in, were the cloakrooms and the toilets. Over Lockdown, we moved all the cloakrooms into classrooms or just outside for much better supervision. Over the Summer the toilets have been knocked down, rebuilt and completely refurbished. Now all toilets are cubicles which open out directly onto the 'Street' areas for complete supervision of children entering and exiting. There are no light switches to be turned off ('to spook your friend'), cubicle dividers are floor to ceiling so no temptation to stand on the toilet to look over or peep under (yes they did!) and nowhere to hide! In this case only, I am not going to apologise for spoiling the fun! They are much more hygienic and easier to clean and by making them Year Group blocks, we are able to supervise and take action if they are not being looked after or treated with respect, much more quickly. Come in and have a look for yourself!

The new scheme called Coventry Energy Fund is designed to help those who:

- Live in Coventry
- Have a combined gross household income of less than £30,000 a year
- Have no household savings
- Have someone living with a vulnerability (such as a long term health condition like COPD; pregnancy; disabled and in receipt of DLA or PIP or in receipt of free school meals). There is some discretion to this part of the scheme so it's well worth checking to see if you qualify.
- Applicants will be required to provide evidence of their customer account with their energy or water provider
- Local energy advice charity, Act on Energy, is administering the scheme and you can apply online.
