Parenting support in CoventryThe Positive Parenting Team provide a wide range of parenting support for all Coventry families. This may be for families planning ahead who are experiencing no difficulties, to families who are experiencing day to day difficulties with relationships, behaviours, feelings or confidence.

They organise and coordinate programmes for parents and carers in Coventry. These are accessible for all parents, carers, grandparents, foster carers, connected persons and special guardians. All programmes are free and we offer limited crèche support for some group programmes.

The new scheme called Coventry Energy Fund is designed to help those who:

- Live in Coventry
- Have a combined gross household income of less than £30,000 a year
- Have no household savings
- Have someone living with a vulnerability (such as a long term health condition like COPD; pregnancy; disabled and in receipt of DLA or PIP or in receipt of free school meals). There is some discretion to this part of the scheme so it's well worth checking to see if you qualify.
- Applicants will be required to provide evidence of their customer account with their energy or water provider
- Local energy advice charity, Act on Energy, is administering the scheme and you can apply online.

Family Learning


Attached are some posters for Family Learning courses starting in September.

Many of our courses are targeted at specific parents from specific schools, but these particular courses are open to all Coventry parents / carers. Some are on-line, some are face to face. Some are just for parents, some are for pre-school children and their carers together.

- Positive Family Foundations (parent only) – an attachment-based parenting course (SENCO's / pastoral staff could signpost parents onto these)

- Online recorded courses (parent only) – Maths in the Primary School, or English in the Primary School, or Positive Family Foundations
- Autumn Fun (parent / preschool children) - stay and play groups led by EYFS specialists – providing parents with support around their own understanding of child development
