Message from the Headteacher

Good morning!

Whilst you are reading this, I will be in assembly sharing the most exciting plans with the children for transforming playtimes at Templars. Please make sure you read the letter on Seesaw this week to learn more because parents are very much involved!

There are so many things happening in the next few weeks and events are being added very frequently so please check the dates and information below.

Staff are trying their best to give you more notice and more information and therefore it is even more important that parents and carers have the right Apps to receive this. So, if you have a friend who seems not to know, encourage them to get Studybugs, Seesaw, ParentPay and Twitter. Our Parent Governor, Emma McCormick and Keri-Ann Taylor on the Unofficial Templars Talk on Facebook, are also great sources of information.

I have a dream! (Ask your child who said this originally to see if they remember from their workshops last month!) But I have a dream too! I am so proud of Templars and its position in the community. I believe we are a unique institution serving both Tile Hill and Canley and I want to grow our influence by building a community centre on site. By supporting our school community, we support our children. With the support of governors, I have been meeting with different community groups who would come to us, and looking to source funding to extend the library and add toilets and a kitchen. This would give us the extra space we need and I have visions of toddler groups, foodbanks, parent groups, youth clubs, adult learning, access to services - the sky is the limit! There is much interest and out of these conversations some groups are keen to get started. So, Early Help officer PCSP Adam Bettison, Sgt Danielle Hawley from the Coventry Youth Violence Reduction Team, and Helen Mansell from the Mosaic Family Hub will be holding a drop in session at Templars Primary School on **Wednesday 6th December from 08:30 – 11:00am**. Please, please help me by supporting this initiative and make the most of the opportunity to come and ask or share anything that concerns you. I am not aware of any other school trying to do this but following the many conversations we have with our parents and carers and the support we try to find for you, I think there is a great need to bring our community together. I need your support to engage services so if you have ever thought nobody listens, nobody cares then come along on the 6th and have your say! Problems with anti-social behaviour? racism? poor parking? unsafe driving? Need support with the cost of living crisis? health concerns? relationship problems? housing? home conditions? Worried about violence and or drugs? There is a great need but if we don't use what is on offer, it is taken away so please stay behind on drop-off or pop back, bring a friend and enjoy a cup of tea and a chat and persuade our supporters on the 6th December that we need their services and many more to support our school community.

Another outstanding opportunity is the chance to meet and chat with our Educational Psychologist, Claire, and Louisa from the Complex Communication Team next Monday - see the flier below. This is an informal event with Mrs King present too and your child does not need to be on the SEND register or have a diagnosis. If you have any concerns about your child and their development, come along, keep warm and have a cup of tea and biscuits too!

Introducing Ocean Club with a plea...



Hello, we are the ocean friendly club. We are pupils in year 5 and 6: Esmee, Hossana, James, Robert, Makin and Matab, who want to make a difference.

We are aiming for the Marine Conservation Society's Ocean Friendly School award. We are investigating how to stop litter from going into our ocean. Some of the things we are investigating are: What happens to materials like plastic, paper, food waste and baby wipes when they get into the ocean. We will also be investigating single use plastic. We need to remember to reduce, recycle, reuse, repurpose and repair.

These facts will amaze you!

Did you know...

- 30 million tons of plastic is produced each year.
- An estimated 8 to 13 million tons of litter ends up in the ocean yearly!
- Every minute, a lorry load of litter ends up in the ocean!

Then main things that are thrown away are:

- Plastic bottles
- Plastic bags

- Plastic bottle caps
- Plastic grocery bags
- Plastic straws and stirrers

Did these facts amaze you?

Why is it important to only flush down the toilet, toilet paper?

Toilet paper is the only paper product engineered to be compatible with the sanitary sewer system. Flushing anything other than human waste and toilet paper can result in sewage back-ups, expensive damages to your home plumbing system, and cause problems to the sewer and water treatment system.

How much damage does litter cause?

Marine litter can also lead to loss of biodiversity and of ecosystem functions and services. For instance, discarded, lost, or abandoned fishing gear are continuing to fish and trap animals, entangling, and potentially killing marine life, smothering habitat, and acting as a hazard to navigation.

How does our litter from Coventry end up in the ocean?

Litter dropped on the street doesn't stay there. Rainwater and wind carry plastic waste into streams and rivers, and through drains. Drains lead to the ocean! Careless and improper waste disposal is also a big contributor – illegal dumping of waste adds greatly to the plastic surge in our seas.

Your support for your child's education is crucial to their progress. Please tell us if there are any adjustments we need to make to help you support your child, for example: letters in large font; letters in different languages; wheelchair access; explaining things over the phone; a discussion with a school colleague of the same gender.

Parenting support in CoventryThe Positive Parenting Team provide a wide range of parenting support for all Coventry families. This may be for families planning ahead who are experiencing no difficulties, to families who are experiencing day to day difficulties with relationships, behaviours, feelings or confidence.

They organise and coordinate programmes for parents and carers in Coventry. These are accessible for all parents, carers, grandparents, foster carers, connected persons and special guardians. All programmes are free and we offer limited crèche support for some group programmes.

Coventry City Council funds Act on Energy to provide a variety of support for Coventry residents. The work covers a wide range of services from energy bill advice, fuel Switching, referrals for physical measures, grant availability and onwards referrals to other agencies if appropriate. To access the funding residents should be owner-occupiers of a property or people living in private rented accommodation and **must have** a long term diagnosed health condition or disability affected by living in a cold home. Financial circumstances are also a consideration – there is a range of income thresholds dependent upon the number of people who live in the property. We can also offer expert advice and support to anyone living in Coventry. Funding is available for:

- External wall insulation
- Cavity wall insulation
- First time gas central heating
- Broken boiler replacement
- Inefficient gas boiler
- Loft insulation
- Upgrade or repair of electric storage heaters

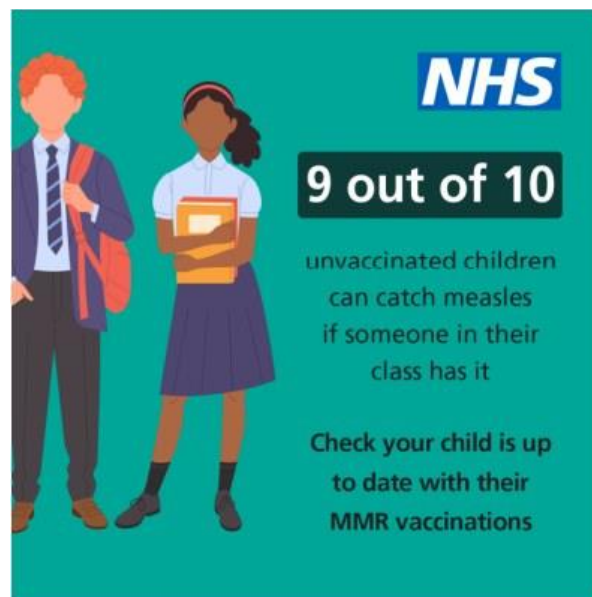
