Message from the Headteacher

"Moments matter, attendance counts"

Reminder: Tuesday is class photo and Year 6 photo day - smart uniform and brushed hair!

Good morning,

Thank you for the positive comments on the new arrangements for Celebration Assembly - it was lovely to have so many parents and carers attend on Friday afternoon and the children were buzzing to invite you in.

We have had a few incidents at the beginning and end of the day recently and I am asking for your help to remind your children of some basic safety. Whilst it is lovely that some children race into

school as the gates open, one of the Reception children was accidentally knocked over, on Tuesday. Unfortunately, the children and parents with them, probably didn't notice but with families arriving from both gates, and the youngest children going against the tide to get to Nursery and Reception, please take care and perhaps let the children run after they pass the Reception gate.

On Thursday, a child lost their parent on collection and walked a long way towards home, onto Tile Hill Lane, looking for them. Please remind the children that if they become separated from you on collection, children should return through the gates and come and find one of the school adults who stand on the gates, morning or night. They will then be kept safe until you find them.

As the weather improves, it is tempting to allow your children to play in the grounds and on the equipment but staff are not responsible for pupils once they have been released into your care and unfortunately, one child broke their arm this week after school. With the gates open, it is a vulnerable time in terms of safeguarding. Staff on the gates are keen to support families to leave school efficiently and safely and then secure the site as soon as possible. These staff then need to attend to their duties back in school.

Moving on, during school hours this week, pupils have been becoming fully immersed in their new topics through their Spark Days which are days full of activity and fun designed to promote enquiry and questions to be answered throughout the term. Your children should have brought home their topic webs and all Knowledge Organisers are on the school website. These help you to ask them questions and share in their learning. Some of our most exciting trips are taking place this term - the seaside, London and the Botanical Gardens to name a few and I have heard and had many conversations on how to keep costs as low as possible. I would like you to know that we are not allowed to make a profit on trips and we also want EVERY child to go on trips which contribute to their learning. If you are anxious about letting your child go on a trip for any reason, please contact your class teacher in the first instance and let us help.

Staff have been busy too with training on reducing anxiety to help pupils engage and learn more. We are also having training on dyslexia over the next couple of weeks (this is what we do after school!) Later in the year, we will be having training on Emotion Coaching but if you would like to get ahead of us, then take a look at the parents course.

- Are more emotionally stable
- Are more resilient
- Achieve more academically in school
- Have fewer behavioural problems

This session will introduce the steps of Emotion Coaching and its scientific basis and will involve practical activities and resource sharing so that parents can begin to use this increasingly popular approach straight after the session.
