Tips For Wellness

Supporting your Child at School

Young people can feel anxious about school for lots of different reasons. They might be worried about making friends or fitting in, find schoolwork or lessons confusing, feel pressured to learn in a certain way or find their relationships with teachers difficult. Sometimes, going through difficult experiences outside of school – such as a death or an illness in the family can also make it harder for a child to feel settled at school.

For some young people, the school environment can feel really difficult, and trying to fit into it can create a huge amount of stress. This might be the case if they are struggling with their mental health or have a neurodiverse condition such as autism or ADHD. This can make the school environment anxiety-provoking and exhausting, especially if their condition or need is undiagnosed or they are not currently accessing the support/ strategies they need.

Our Top Tips For Supporting your Child at School:

Create a morning routine or timetable. A routine can create a sense of security and reduce stress for your child and for you too. Try to prepare things like packing bags and laying out clothes the night before.

Think together about how your child can manage their anxiety. Younger children might like to use a [worry box](#) at home to help contain their anxieties. Teenagers might like to fill a box with things that help them feel calm using our [guide to making a self-soothe box](#). Scan the QR codes below to find instructions:

Encourage them to do things that help them relax. Having time to unwind after school can be important. This could be spending time with friends and family, listening to music, going for a walk or run, playing sport, baking, drawing or watching a favourite film.

Recognise small achievements. Notice small successes such as getting out of bed at the right time or handing work in at school – and tell your child how proud you are of them.

Try to take the pressure off. On some days your child may not be able to manage schoolwork or homework. Remember their mood will go up and down and you can always try again the next day.

In Coventry and Warwickshire, for any urgent mental health concerns, contact the RISE Crisis Helpline available 24/7, by calling NHS 111. Alternatively, call 999 or visit A&E in an emergency, for example if medical attention is required.

MHST are available to support you and your school throughout the school year including term time and school holidays.

The cost of Tina's current breakfast club will reduce from £4.85 to £3.00 from Monday 2nd June. This is because it will end at 8.15am when the new free breakfast club begins. The children will transfer over.

What is the new breakfast club offer?

We are excited to be part of the government's breakfast club early adopter scheme, which is funding universal breakfast clubs in up to 750 primary schools. From summer term 2025, free breakfast clubs will be available in early adopter schools, as part of a test and learn phase, so that the government can plan for a full national roll-out of universal breakfast clubs in primary schools.

As part of the offer, Templars will offer 30 minutes of childcare alongside a free breakfast. The club is open to all pupils from Reception to Year 6.

How long will this last for?

The scheme will run from summer term 2025 until at least the end of Spring term 2026. The government is still making decisions about the timing of a full national rollout.

Why is the government doing this?

Breakfast clubs will ensure every child, no matter their circumstances, can achieve their full potential by providing a supportive start to the day. Breakfast clubs offer much more than just food; they can serve as a welcoming space for children, providing valuable opportunities for them to play, learn, and socialise at the beginning of the school day.

Will the new free breakfast clubs be in every primary school from summer term 2025?

No, only schools that have been selected to be part of the early adopter scheme will be funded by the Government from April. The government has announced its intention for every state-funded primary school to offer a free breakfast club and will announce further details on that at a later date.

Is the club free for my child to attend?

Yes – the club is free to attend for 30 mins from 8.15 to 8.30.

What can my child expect from the club?

Your child will be given breakfast and will be supervised whilst they eat during the breakfast club. There will be activities such as colouring, games and toys or just a place to chill and chat!

What food will you serve to my child at the breakfast club?

Your child will be offered a nutritious breakfast during the breakfast club. This will include cereals, pastries, bagels, milk and water to drink and plenty of fruit and veg. All food offered will be compliant with School Food Standards.

My child has an allergy or dietary requirement, how will you ensure that this is accommodated?

The safety of food allergies, food intolerance or Coeliac Disease attending breakfast clubs is a priority. If your child has an allergy or dietary requirement we should already be aware of this so it can be managed safely. We will provide parents and carers with the allergenic ingredients used in the foods available.

If your child/children have an individual healthcare plan, this should clearly define what constitutes an emergency and explain what to do, including ensuring that all relevant staff are aware of emergency symptoms and procedures

What time will the club start?

The free breakfast club will begin at 8.15am.

What time will the club end?

The free breakfast club will end at 8.45am , as the school day begins. Your child will be taken to their classroom for the start of the school day.

What will happen to the longer breakfast club that I'm paying for now?

We are continuing to run our full morning breakfast club offer from 7.30am to 8.15am. The charge for this has been reduced to £3. Parents can continue to use Tax-Free Childcare and Universal Credit to support the cost of attending the club from 7.30am.

Do I need to book a place for my child?

The free club is open to all children from Reception to Year 6.

There will be NO booking system for the FREE club only. You must continue to book with Tina for the paid provision before 8.15am

The free club will begin on Monday 2nd June but there will be a special breakfast event week beginning 9th June with a different special every day! We want as many children as possible to come during this week to enjoy a relaxed, fun and healthy start to the day.


