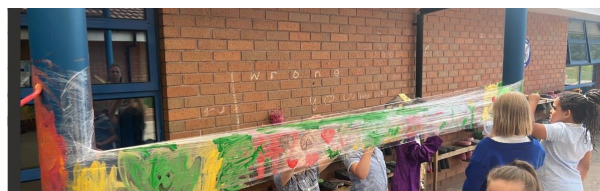

### **Uniform Reminder – Building Pride and Belonging at Templars**

At Templars Primary School, we want every child to feel a strong sense of pride and belonging. A key part of this is wearing the correct school uniform. It supports our value of respect, and promotes fairness and unity—and helps all children to feel part of our shared school community.

Lately, we've seen a growing number of children arriving in school without the correct PE kit. Please remember that our PE kit is **simple and non-branded**:

- **A plain white T-shirt**
- **Plain black shorts or joggers**
- **No logos** please

This uniform should be worn **only on PE days for KS2 children**. Children in Reception and KS1 **should be changing into their PE kits at school**, as learning to change independently—and quickly—is an important life skill we are helping them to develop.

When some children follow the rules and others do not, it can cause unnecessary friction. It also places staff in a difficult position when they are trying to uphold the policy and are ignored or challenged. We ask all parents and carers to support us in applying the same expectations fairly to everyone.

Our uniform is **designed to be practical, affordable, and widely available** from most high street supermarkets. There is no requirement for items to carry the school logo, although logo items can be purchased from Brigade Clothing if you prefer.

**Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name.**

To help families, we'll be putting out **good quality, second-hand uniform** in the coming weeks, including items suitable for next year. Please feel free to take what you need. If you are able to offer a small donation, it will go towards replenishing our uniform stock—but there is absolutely no obligation to do so.

I do understand that it doesn't make sense to replace shoes at this time of year if they have been outgrown and teachers have been told to relax this rule for now although you may still be challenged if the alternative footwear is not safe or suitable.

Let's work together to make sure every child feels proud to wear their uniform and proud to be part of Templars.

# Hearing Screening Clinics for Reception Children



Did you know your child is entitled to a free hearing test whilst they are in reception class? Here are signs that may indicate hearing difficulties:

- Not responding when called
- Speaking very loudly
- Frequently asking for repetitions or responding inappropriately
- Increasing volume on devices
- Appearing to daydream
- Slow to learn or unclear speech
- Frequent frustration or aggression
