

Templars Primary School Sports Premium Overview

At Templars Primary School our vision is to develop every child to their full potential. We believe that Physical Education and sports contribute to the development of our children and through participation, our children build and learn more about our key values such as respect, co-operation and kindness for themselves and others.

Aims of our Sports Premium Provision

- To increase the number of children involved in extra-curricular sports by giving every child the opportunity to take part in sports and lifestyle activities both in intra and inter school competitions.
- For all pupils to experience a wider range of health, PE and Sports activities.
- To enable all pupils to have healthy lifestyles through the opportunities available at school and the choices they make for their own lives.
- To upskill teachers in their knowledge and delivery of the PE curriculum
- To create a sustainable curriculum and to improve the sports facilities at Templars Primary School.

Funding for schools is calculated by the number of primary age pupils (between the age of 5 and 11) as at the January census. All schools with 17 or more pupils will receive a lump sum of £16 000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. This is calculated on an academic year rather than a financial year.

Evidencing the impact of Sports Premium Funding

Ofsted Inspectors have been asked to consider the impact of the Primary Sports funding in pupils' lifestyles and physical wellbeing taking into account the following factors:

1. Increase participation rates in such activities such as games, gymnastics, swimming and athletics.
2. Increase knowledge of teachers with the subject area through CPD, team teaching and access to resources.
3. Increase amount of, and success in, competitive sports both inter and intra school.
4. Provide a more inclusive PE curriculum.
5. Support growth in the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities (new sports).
6. Improved partnership working on physical education with other schools and local partners.
7. Linking PE and health with another subject which contributes to pupil's overall achievements and their greater social, moral, spiritual and cultural skills.
8. Greater awareness amongst pupils around health and wellbeing e.g. dangers of smoking, obesity and other such activities that undermine pupils' health.
9. Improved PE lesson planning and pupils assessment.
