Some Final Logistics now:

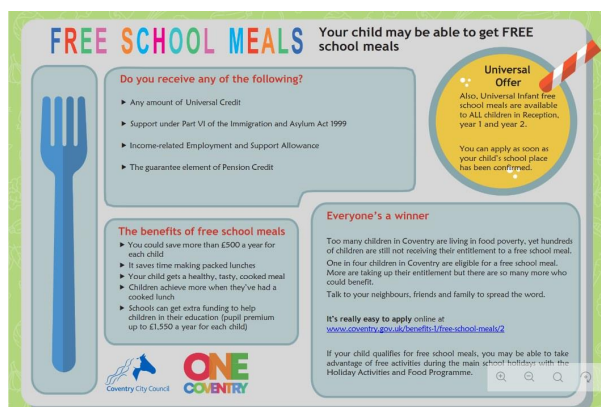
