Hot and sweaty have been the classroom conditions this week, as I am sure your children have told you!

An unintended consequence of the extreme heat is that it sometimes triggers the fire alarms. Thank you to the many people who praised our evacuation procedure on Wednesday—we take all safeguarding practices very, very seriously.

Can I please reassure everyone that we would never conduct a planned fire drill during drop off and collection times and therefore if the alarm sounds, it is genuine. Also, we will never just assume it is the heat. We have to investigate our large site and be absolutely sure before re-entry.

If the alarm sounds and you have not already arrived on the playground, please stop & move back away from the school. If you are already on the playground please move away onto the grass allowing space for the children to be safely evacuated under their teachers supervision.

Thank you to the vast majority of parents and carers who showed patience and modelled responsible behaviours for our pupils.

Meanwhile, please make sure your child has a water bottle in school every day, suncream and sunhats also welcomed. We also always make sure classrooms are open for shade at breaktimes on extremely hot days.
