Every Child, Every Day, Every Chance this week: SAT's

A popular topic among the year 6 community currently are the upcoming SATs tests. I understand why people are worried about the event, but there is really no need to fear. The Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs) are designed for the year 6's, not for year 9's, not for the year 2's. They were built to assess the skills you currently know, meaning everything has already been taught. So as long as you don't forget anything, you should be alright. You should also keep in mind that we have been practising for these tests for years—that's not an exaggeration. In year 2 we did our practice SATs, in year 3 onwards we did our 99 clubs and in 6 we have been completing masses of preparation tests and challenges.
