## Every Child, Every Day, Every Chance this week:

it has been a back-to-basics week. **Learning to Learn weeks** are all about resetting and reminding ourselves of the values, behaviours and routines which allow our best learning to take place.

We have been revisiting our Keeping Safe learning; talking about who is on our **Network Hands** (people who keep us safe), what to do when we feel our Early Warning Signs, and considering whether **'My fun, is fun for everyone'** which links with our work on Anti-Bullying.

We have also introduced **SLANT** which is a new reminder to improve concentration in class:

Sit Up

Listen

Answer Questions

Never Interrupt

Track the Speaker

Finally, new themes will have been introduced and teachers will have been finding out what the children already know about them in a **Knowledge Harvest**.

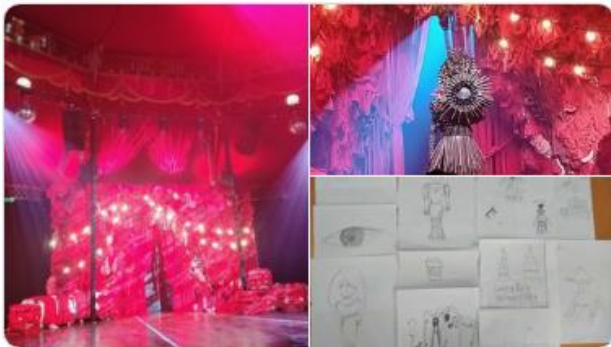
